

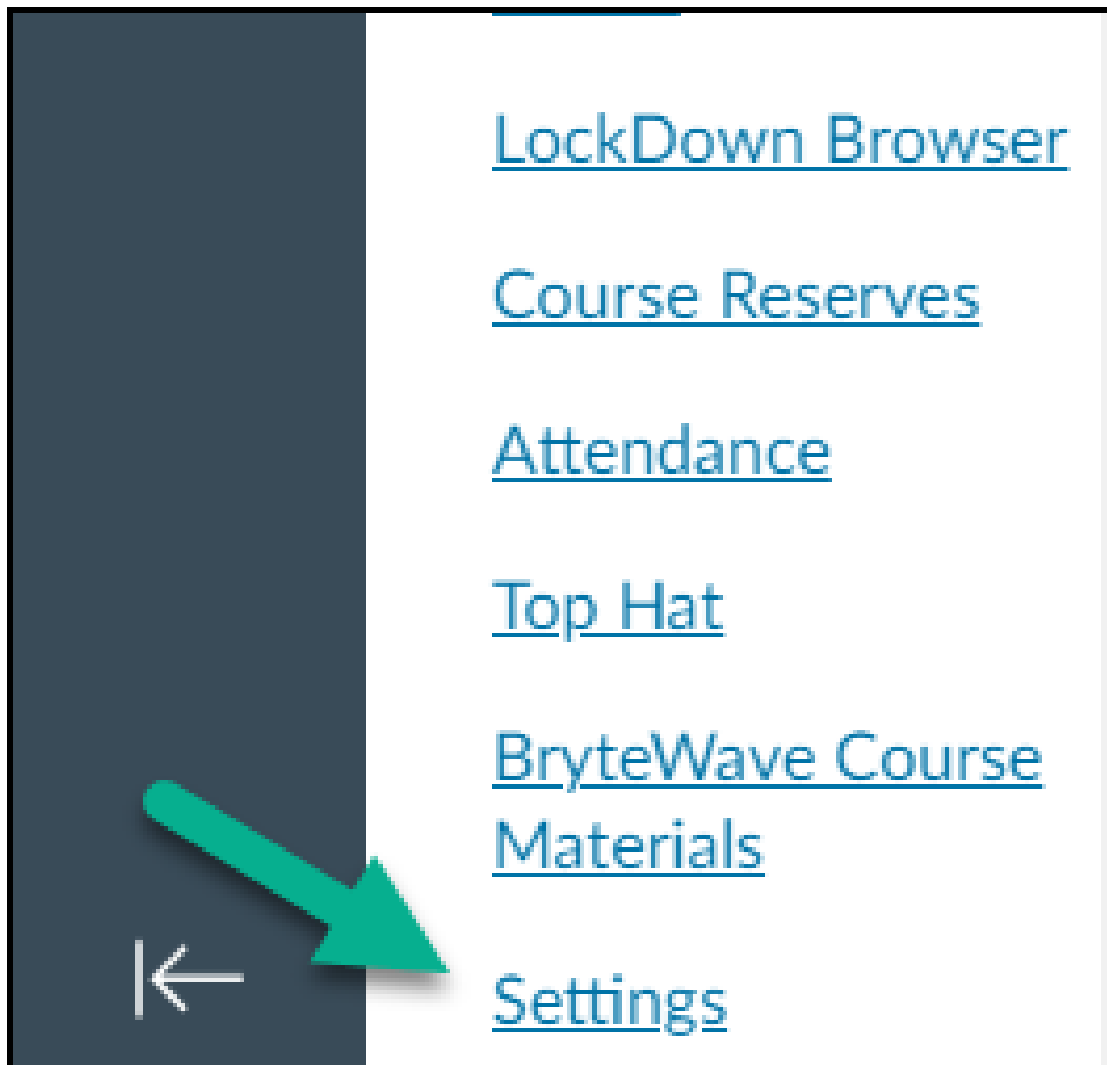
Adding a Library Lesson to a Canvas Course

1. Download Library Lesson Zip File

Download the appropriate Library Lesson zip file from the Information Literacy Lessons page.

2. Add SCORM to the Navigation Menu

Go to Settings on the Navigation menu.




Go to Navigation. Drag SCORM from the hidden menu to the visible menu. Click on Save.

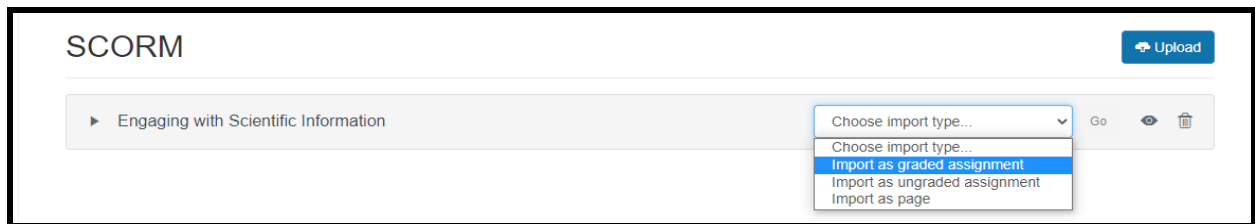

3. Upload Library Lesson


Once you've added SCORM to the navigation menu, go to the SCORM link. Upload the Library Lesson Zip File.

From the Choose import type drop-down menu, select the option you want applied to the lesson (graded or ungraded). Then click on Go.




4. Set Assignment Specifications

If you imported the lesson as a graded assignment it will show up on the Assignments area of your Canvas course. You can edit the assignment with your preferred due date and point allotment. Then click Save & Publish.
