With the growth of Hispanic studies in colleges and universities, UH Libraries is building a strong archival and research collection that will serve students and scholars in the disciplines of Hispanic studies, art, English, history, law, music, sociology, and more. The collection supports UH Libraries' core value of providing resources that promote and value diversity while reflecting the unique essence of our people and our region.

The Hispanic Research Collection will serve the community to enrich and empower our students, our university, and the world. In a diverse urban city, like Houston, every person's potential can be elevated, and the economy fueled, by simply having a leading public university library woven into the fabric of the community. Building a significant Hispanic Research Collection will capture the creativity and drive of Hispanic families, businesses, and culture that influences others around the nation and around the world.

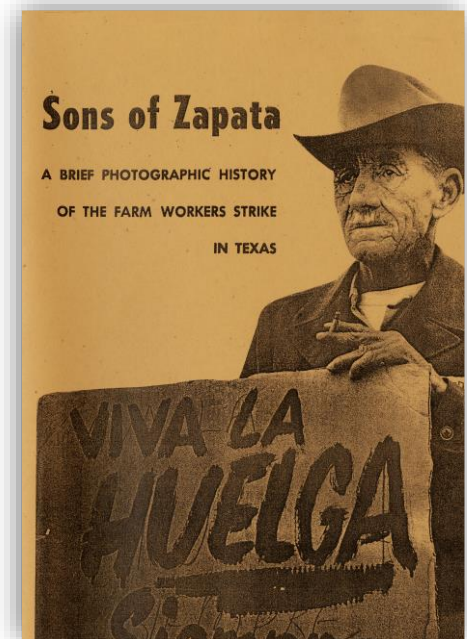
Vision

- Developing presentations, programming, exhibits and digital assets in partnership with the Hispanic community, area organizations, and campus units, to enrich the academic and intellectual objectives of students, faculty, scholars, and lifelong learners.
- Preserving materials that would otherwise be lost.
- Digitizing collection materials to make them accessible to students, teachers, scholars, industry, and activists beyond the limits of print and the walls of the library onto the global stage.
- Creating on-line and on-site exhibits of collection materials to engage the public with the Hispanic Research Collection.
- Engaging UH and community students from different disciplines to be a part of our archival, exhibition, digital scholarship, and research programs, providing unique opportunities to gain experience and understanding of Hispanic history and the Hispanic experience.
- Empowering students with greater knowledge of the Hispanic presence and their legacy.
- Organizing speakers and events that highlight our collections and programs.
- Securing and preserving Houston's cultural legacy for future scholarship.
